UPCOMING SUMMER CAMPS

Studies show that summer break exacerbates the achievement gap—the majority of low-income youth lack access to the kinds of summer programs available in more affluent classrooms. Lincoln's summer camps across the East Bay prevent scores of young people from suffering learning loss and other impacts of being away from school.

REVERSING IMPACTS OF TRAUMA

Twenty-five percent of students in America will experience trauma by age **four**—by age 16, that number grows to a staggering two-thirds. Repeated trauma can cause irreversible harm to a child's brain without intervention—affecting emotion and behavior. At Lincoln, trained professionals work closely with children to reverse this success-jeopardizing damage—so that we can expand what's possible.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE & LEARNING PROGRAMS

Ninety-six percent of youth in Lincoln's comprehensive school engagement programs improved attendance—a core element of learning and success. Because of you, Lincoln pairs education services with family support and continues to raise the bar for kids, getting them to school, reading by third grade, and following a strong path to graduation.
